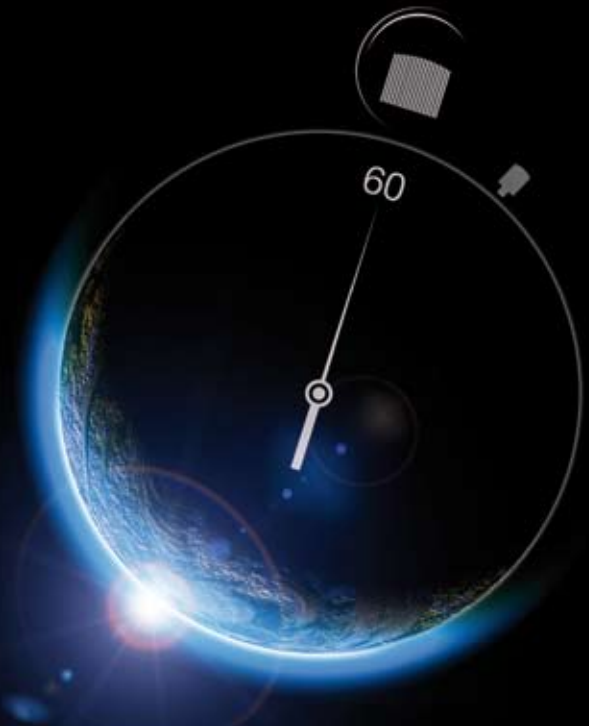

Jonathon Porritt CBE

Jonathon is Britain's best known and most well-respected environmental campaigner. A former Co-Chair of the Green Party, Director of Friends of the Earth, in 2000 he was appointed by Tony Blair to be Chairman of the UK Sustainable Development Commission – a post he left this summer.

Awarded a CBE in 2000 for services to environmental protection, Jonathon speaks as Co-Founder and Programme Director of Forum for the Future – the UK's leading sustainable development charity. Known to the media as Prince Charles's 'Green Guru', Jonathon is also a Co-Director of The Prince of Wales Business and the Environment Programme.

Richard Lyddon

Richard's broadcasting career spans 25 years and ranges from local radio to network TV. He is a former Senior Correspondent for TV-am and Sky News. He has made investigative documentaries and reports for ITV and C4 news as well as being the anchor for ITV West news.

**Finding your way to
The Hatton**

By Underground: The nearest underground stations are: Farringdon Station (Metropolitan, Circle, Hammersmith and City Lines) – approx. 5 mins.
Chancery Lane Station (Central Line) – approx. 10 mins.

By Rail: Farringdon Station is the closest main line station to The Hatton – approx. 5 mins.

By Car: There are three NCP car parks within close proximity of The Hatton, one directly opposite the building. The other two are located on Cross Street (Saffron Hill NCP) and on Bowling Green Lane (off Farringdon Road).
