Justin Webb is a British journalist who has worked for the BBC since 1984. In August 2009, he replaced Edward Stourton on the BBC's influential Today programme.

In December 2007 he became North American Editor for BBC News, a role newly created in time for the American presidential election of 2008. He replaced Matt Frei who moved to present the new World News America bulletin. Webb was previously the BBC's chief Washington correspondent from 2001.

Richard's broadcasting career now spans 25 years and ranges from local radio to network TV. He is a former Senior Correspondent for TV-am and Sky News. He has made investigative documentaries and news reports for ITV and C4 news as well as being the anchor for ITV West news.
